# Happy New Year!

Thanks to the many hours of hard work of our volunteers and the generosity of our members, 2023 was a most successful year.

The Friends' signature event, the Great American Book Sale raised a record \$77,379 after expenses in June 2023.

The small book sales set a record with proceeds before expenses of \$5,794 for the February sale, \$4,887 for the May sale, and \$5,912 in October for a total of \$16,593.

Other funds are raised through the Bayfront Bookshelf, online sales through Abe Books, memberships and Erie Gives. The Friends also receive donations from community members, individuals interested in supporting libraries and as memorials. The Erie Community College, Erie Community Foundation and Erie Insurance provided generous sponsorships of the Great American Book Sale.

- Bayfront Bookshelf net sales totaled \$20,716
- The second full year of Abe Books online sales came to \$3,569 after expenses
- Memberships donations for the year were \$4,175 in total
- Erie Gives provided \$16,164
- Other donations contributed \$21,183
- Income from Blasco Workshops came to \$1,965
- Sponsorships amounted in total to \$5,500

Successful fundraising allowed the board to recently approve the library's budget request of \$76,730 for 2024. The budget includes funding for Youth and Adult Services, Outreach, and Staff Development.

The mission of the Friends of the Library is to support and advocate for our public library. All funds raised are for the benefit of the library.

#### 2024 Book Sales

The Great American Book Sale will return to the Flo Fabrizio Ice Rink in 2024. Sale dates are Sunday, June 16 through Friday, June 21, 2024.

The 2024 small sales are scheduled for the following dates:

February Book Lover Sale: Thursday, Feb. 15 through Saturday, Feb. 17

May Sale: Thursday, May 9 through Saturday, May 11

October Sale: Thursday, Oct. 17 through Saturday, Oct. 19

As usual, postcard reminders will be sent in the weeks before a sale.

#### How to Donate Books and Other Materials

The Friends of the Library accepts donations of gently used books, books on CD, music CDs, DVDs and puzzles. Best selling items are new fiction, especially suspense and mystery; children's books; local history; books on CD and DVD's. We do not accept encyclopedias; Reader's Digest condensed books; textbooks; magazines, pamphlets; outdated technical books (5 years or older) such as law, medicine, computers, health; multiple copies of the same title; yellowed paperbacks; books that are damaged (ripped, mildewed, underline, have an odor); and VHS or cassette tapes.

Jigsaw puzzle donations need to be taped closed. Attach a sticker indicating if the puzzle is complete or if pieces are missing. We sell puzzles with up to three missing pieces at our sales for a dollar. We cannot accept puzzles with more than three missing pieces.

The Bayfront Bookshelf serves as a drop off point for SMALL donations of used books, media and puzzles when we are open. If the store is closed, donations can be taken to the Blasco Library circulation desk. Do not leave items in the foyer when the store is closed as this presents a fire hazard.

The Erie County Library branches also accept small donations when open and as space permits. Please call ahead. If you have a large amount to donate, please call us during store hours at 814-451-6942 or write to us at info@erielibraryfriends.org. If you provide your contact information, we will call you to make an appointment for a drop off.

### Library Programs and Events Sponsored by the Friends of the Library

The Friends of the Library was among the sponsors of two noteworthy events last fall. In October, the **Small Business Symposium** offered classes and a grant workshop for small business owners in the creative sector. And in November, **Erie Makes**, an Idea Lab event, brought together maker enthusiasts of all ages and interests. The event offered activities and classes at multiple locations from Acryllic Pours to Design Your Own Podcast! to Tiny Tin Shadow Boxes (a teen event). Make-and-take kits were available.

In 2023, funding from the Friends of the Library supported many of the 268 programs for children, 68 for teens and 459 for adults offered at the Blasco Library. This is in addition to sponsorship of many of the 1214 programs offered at the branch libraries. Programs supported by the Friends include computer classes and Idea Lab classes, which use materials or facilitator fees paid by the Friends of the Library.

Join Heather in the Idea Lab to learn how to make a simple set of beach glass earrings using a Dremel tool and jewelry pliers. At the Lincoln Community Center, learn to crochet in February and to knit in March with instruction provided by staff member Sarah McCall. Both classes include a kit with basic materials. Iroquois Branch offerings include another in the hands-on Fermentation Friday series, Sourdough Culture, with Jessica Stefano in mid-January.

Balancing Dragon Yoga for Adults is scheduled on Saturday mornings from January through April at Lincoln with a class for tweens and teens in late January. Based on Hatha and Vinyasa style yoga, Balancing Dragon Yoga offers a gentle and accessible approach to yoga taught by Kimber Gavio.

The JR. Explorers! STEM classes for age 3-6 offer child-led, experiential learning through guided freeplay. First in the series of four at Blasco Library is The Floor is Lava on January 27. Also at Blasco, younger children and families will enjoy Pajama Storytimes. The monthly evening story times begin in January and conclude on April 17 with the Stuffed Animal Party.

#### Membership

At this writing the Friends have 489 members. There have been 106 membership renewals and 5 new memberships since the start of the membership drive in October.
